Heart of a Samurai by Margi Preus Historical fiction A 2011 Newbery Honor Book

It is 1841 and fourteen-year old Manjiro and his four friends find themselves stranded on a deserted island after a storm at sea. Beyond the island is the unknown, filled with monsters and demons and barbarians, or so they have been told. They know they cannot return to their home in Japan—the country's borders are closed to foreigners and to citizens who have strayed.

One day, an American whaling vessel passes near the island and takes the castaways aboard. Manjiro joins in the work of the ship, eager to learn everything he can about this strange new culture. Over the next ten years, he travels the high seas, visiting places he never dreamed existed, including America. But deep down he longs to return home and somehow—though he knows it is impossible for a simple fisherman—become a samurai.

Will Manjiro ever be able to get back to his native land? And if he does, will he be welcomed or condemned?

What is the initial **conflict** that helps create the rising action in the story? This is the beginning problem that moves the story forward.

What happens in the resolution /denouement of the story?

The next section focuses on major *topics* and *symbols*. Topics are large abstract ideas like: change, courage, tradition, duty, emotion, family, fate, and happiness. Select two topics that are important to the story. State one topic for number one and a different topic for number two; on the lines explain how these topics are important to the story. In addition to the two topics, select two symbols that appear frequently in the story. Symbols are objects that appear frequently and represent something more than what meets the eye. For example, a dove can symbolize peace; rain can symbolize sadness; a skull can symbolize death. Explain the symbolism of what your chosen object symbolizes in the story. Again, all lines must be filled in completely in order to receive full credit.
